On 1st and 2nd September the workshop „Microbial Hazards in the Feed Chain“ will take place at the Bundesinstitut für Risikobewertung (Federal Institute for Risk Assessment).

The workshop aims to intensify the exchange between private and governmental stakeholders as well as academia to exchange the current state of knowledge regarding microbial hazards in the feed chain.

Based on the “from farm to fork” principle three main topics are in the focus:

1. Microbial hazards in the feed chain

Introduction to the topic including safety issues on feed and food, feed import and export - microbial hazards and vulnerable points as well as microbial hazards in the feed supply chain for food of animal origin.

2. Feed processing and animal nutrition

Series of lectures on feed technologies as well as on the influence of feed processing on the microbial status of feed and animal nutrition.

3. Feed processing, microbial status and case studies

Series of lectures on feed hygiene measures, possibilities and limits of the detection of bacterial contaminations as well as case studies.
