On behalf of the ADSA Board of Directors and the Editors of *Journal of Dairy Science* (JDS), I would like to thank you for your contributions to the high Impact Factor of the journal. According to the Web of Science, yours is among the 100 most highly cited papers published in JDS since the beginning of 2012.

In the current edition of ISI's Journal Citation Reports, 55 journals are ranked in the Agriculture, Dairy, and Animal Science category. In this category, JDS ranked second by Impact Factor, second by 5-Year Impact Factor, and first by Eigenfactor Score (which removes self-citations). The 2014 Impact Factor for JDS increased to 2.573, up from 2.550 for 2013. Much of the increase in Impact Factor occurred because the number of citations to the most frequently cited papers increased significantly. JDS continues to be highly ranked in the Food Science and Technology category, too. The journal ranked 22nd out of 123 journals in that category.

We sincerely appreciate your valuable contributions to dairy science and to JDS. We are aware that authors have many options when choosing where to publish their work. We are pleased that you selected JDS for publication of for your paper. We look forward to future submissions from your group. Please share the good news and also our thanks with your co-authors.
